<u>A Papal Anecdote</u> - Speaking about the Corporal Works of Mercy, Pope Francis said we are to open our hearts and find new ways to help meet others' needs, and warned against the trap of closing in ourselves. How we welcome the stranger will be considered at the Last Judgement. The "stranger" is often the immigrant in our midst, he noted, and in every age, immigration calls for a response for openness and solidarity. He then shared an anecdote of an elderly woman who helped an immigrant.

As the lady came across this young man who was without shoes, they began to speak and she asked him, "What are you searching for?" "Saint Peter's' to go through the Holy Door," he replied. Moved with sympathy, she thought to herself: "But how can he walk? He doesn't even have shoes. She insisted on getting him a taxi. When it arrived, the driver was hesitant to accept the passenger, as he smelled very badly, but finally agreed to take him. On the way to the Vatican, the lady and the immigrant spoke about his history, what he had lived through, the trials, the war etc. When the lady went to pay, the driver said: "No, Signora. It is I who must pay you, because you made me listen to a story that changed my heart."

In our own day, Pope Francis noted, the growing influx of refugees fleeing war, famine and dire poverty is a summons to welcome and care for these brothers and sisters. As Christians we are never to close our hearts to those in need, praying to be open to others, restoring their God-given dignity, so our lives are enriched and our societies are more peaceful.
