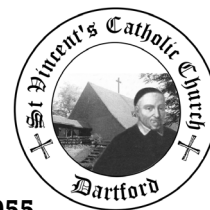

PASTORAL TEAM: As a parish we plan for the future. Every Parishioner is invited to assist with the future of the Parish. My thought is to call a group of volunteers who wish to make plans so as to establish a pastoral plan. This Sunday we witnessed the positive effect of true collaboration. This time it was the result of collaboration with our Parish School. The result of this collaboration resulted in a record mass attendance which we have witnessed for the first time in my thirty two years as a parish priest of St Vincent's. What is needed now is a collaboration of existing bodies and other new ones. There is a considerable amount of talent and generous people in the parish and this is on the increase as more people move into the area. Amongst the things that needs to happen is to revive the various ministries that were in existence before the pandemic. I therefore will be calling a meeting of all the existing members and animators of the various groups that are active at the present moment. Lay ministry in a parish is very important especially in the light of less active clergy in the life of the parish. A date for the meeting will be announced soon.

PERU: Fr Alex - The Peru Project has been the chosen Parish Mission of the millennium from the year two thousand. The support for this project has been outstanding. Each year we raise something in the range of four to five thousand pounds. This goes directly towards the ongoing projects initiated and directed by Fr Alex. Their last project was a health center. This is run mainly by the generosity of benefactors and volunteers. Our modest parish contribution helps towards the success of this in support of a very poor and needy community.
